 - » Title I of the ADA is designed to help people with disabilities access the same employment opportunities and benefits available to people without disabilities.
- **Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC)**

 - » The EEOC is responsible for enforcing federal laws making it illegal to discriminate against a job applicant or an employee because of the person's disability, or because the person made a complaint, filed a charge, or participated in a discrimination investigation or lawsuit.
