Dear Lifeworks Community,

The 2022 Lifeworks Annual Report provides insight into who we are and our impact across Minnesota. With support and feedback from our community, Lifeworks continues to deliver high-quality services that honor choice and break down barriers to inclusion.

In July 2022, we refreshed the Lifeworks mission and vision as part of our 2022 - 2025 Strategic Plan. Our vision and mission emphasize accessibility, partnership, and community. They are rooted in the concept of change we want to build together. Our new vision and mission reinvigorate our core work.

In total, we partnered with 3,001 people with disabilities and their families in 2022, with 736 people receiving career support, 169 people connecting with their communities through Day Support, and 2,051 Minnesotans self-directing their care with Lifeworks. We partnered with 45 people with disabilities in Resource Navigation, supporting them in gaining the tools to take the next step.

Lifeworks leaned into our value of "You Lead - We Listen" by embracing a community-based model for our Day Support program in Brooklyn Park. We heard that 84% of our current clients at that facility most enjoy activities in the community, so we are centering their voices and experiences and took the first steps to ingrain our services our services into the fabric of our communities.

We also began focusing on co-creating culturally specific programs with Black, Indigenous, People of Color, and rural communities – bringing us closer to our vision of accessible, equitable, and diverse communities. Lifeworks is excited to be a partner to historically underserved communities so that together we can increase opportunity and access for all.

Lifeworks is confidently moving forward into the new year with our learnings and success from 2022. Thank you for your continued support of Lifeworks and for investing in a more inclusive community.

Self-Directed Services

Lifeworks supported 2,051 individuals with self-directing their services in 2022. As an approved Financial Management Services provider through the State of Minnesota, Lifeworks processes services for people enrolled in the Consumer Directed Community Supports and Consumer Support Grant programs.

Lifeworks also serves as a PCA Choice and as an in-home licensed provider of Individualized Home Supports and Night Supervision.

Employment


Lifeworks is driven by the belief that all people can work and have a meaningful impact in their community. For 36 years, Lifeworks has worked to create a more diverse and inclusive workforce in Minnesota. We connect people to experiences that explore their interests, develop skills, and start or advance their careers.

In 2022, Lifeworks served 736 people in employment services. We supported 142 individuals in finding and starting new jobs – with 89% of those hired directly by the business. And we welcomed 66 new employers throughout the year who are committed to breaking down barriers to employment for people with disabilities.

Day Support

Lifeworks supported 169 people in Day Support Services in 2022 as they connected with their communities, engaged with their peers, and accessed technology. With the people we serve leading the way, we offered opportunities to build self-reliance, including: creative arts, career exploration, music therapy, skill building in the community, self-advocacy development, technology labs, multi-sensory environments, and so much more.

In 2022, Lifeworks partnered with 45 people with disabilities in Resource Navigation. This service is designed to help people with disabilities gain the tools to take the next step. With individuals leading the way, we assist them in exploring possibilities and building connections with the resources that align with their goals.




REVENUE 2022


